Mr. Bartosz Cichocki, Undersecretary of State for Security, Consular Affairs and Eastern Policy.

Born in 1976, he graduated from the University of Warsaw's Institute of History. He is a long-time specialist in Eastern issues.

Bartosz Cichocki worked at the KARTA Centre; at the Marek Karp Centre for Eastern Studies, as a Russian regional policy analyst; at the Polish Institute of International Affairs, as a coordinator for the Russia and Eurasia programme; and at the National Security Bureau, as a specialist for Russian foreign and security policy, and later as Head of the International Affairs

Section. Between 2015 and 2016, Bartosz Cichocki worked at the Polish Embassy in Moscow where he was charged with bilateral and press relations. Most recently, he was an adviser to the Head of the Foreign Intelligence Agency.



Dr. Adam Eberhardt is Director of the Centre for Eastern Studies (OSW).

From 2008 to 2016, he was OSW Deputy Director. Earlier, Dr. Eberhardt worked as Head of Research at the Polish Institute of International Affairs (PISM) and Chief Correspondent of the Polish news agency PAP in Moscow. He is a member of the Polish-Ukrainian Presidential Consulting Committee and the Polish-Russian Group for Difficult Issues.



Mrs. Małgorzata Gosiewska, Deputy of the Sejm (V, VII, VIII term). She is the Chair of the Polish-Romanian Parliamentary Group and the Chair of the Polish-Georgian Parliamentary Group. She also acts as a Deputy Chair of the Foreign Affairs Committee, Deputy Chair of the Parliamentary Delegation to the Parliamentary Assembly of the Republic of Poland and Ukraine and Deputy Chair of the Parliamentary Delegation to the Parliamentary Assembly of the Sejm and Senate of the **Republic of Poland and the Seimas of the Republic of Lithuania**

Born on 22 July, 1966 in Gdańsk, she has worked as an expert in the office of the President of Poland, Lech Kaczyński, and has been a member of Mazovian Regional Parliament.



Mr. Jakub Groszkowski is a head of Central European Department at the Centre for Eastern Studies (OSW). Before joining the OSW he was a journalist at Polish public radio. He graduated in political science at University of Warsaw, where he read also Slavic studies and East European Studies. For one year he studied at Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica. He focuses mostly on foreign and domestic policies of the Czech Republic and Slovakia, as well as cooperation in Central Europe.



Mr. Marek Marszałek, Programme Manager for Romania and Moldova within the Institute for Eastern Studies. For many years he has been a keen promoter of the Polish-Romanian cooperation. Joined the Institute in 2013, where he is responsible for initiating and developing partnerships with the Romanian and Moldovan institutions, local governments, think tanks and academics. He has coordinated and managed events organized in Romania and Moldova, including the EU-Moldova Forum, Balti, 2014.



Mr. Jerzy Polaczek, former Minister of Transport (2005-2007), Deputy to the Sejm (III, IV, V, VI, VII and VIII term). Deputy Chair of the Polish-Romanian Parliamentary Group, Chair of the Polish-Slovak Parliamentary Group, Deputy Chair of the Infrastructure Committee and Deputy Chair of the Committee on Public Administration and Home Affairs Committee.

Born on 24 August 1961 in Piekary Śląskie, he graduated law at the University of Silesia.



Mr. Bogdan Rzońca, Deputy to the Sejm (VII and VIII term), Chair of the Infrastructure Committee, Member of the Committee on Public Administration and Home Affairs Committee. Born on 1 February 1961 in Zarzecze, he graduated from the Jagiellonian University. He is a doctor of economy, teacher. For many years he has been involved in the local government – he has been a Marshal of the Podkarpackie Voivodeship (1998-2002).
