*Mr. Emmanuel DUPUY is the President of the Prospective and Security Institute in Europe, a specialized think tank on defense and security issues, especially from a Euro-African perspective. He is an associate professor at Catholic University of Lille. He was also an Associate Professor at the Paris-South University (Master Diploma and Strategic Negotiations). He is also a researcher in the interdisciplinary study center of the University Paris-Sud. He is also a Visiting Professor at Ningbo University (China). Former Ministerial Advisor to the State Secretariat for Defense and Veterans Affairs (2008-2010), Emmanuel Dupuy also he has been the political adviser to the French forces in Afghanistan (2011). As a reputed specialist in European security and international relations he worked at the Military School Research and Strategic Institute (IRSEM). Mr. Emmanuel DUPUY is Expert Member of the University of Montreal's Peace Operations Research Network (ROP) and also a member of the Francophone Peace Operations Expertise and Training Network (REFFOP).*
